

## Hawker's Hut walk

This gentle clifftop walk encompasses breath-taking views of North Cornwall's coast. You'll come across a beautiful church, believed to date back to Saxon times, and of course, Hawker's Hut, the refuge of poet Reverend Robert Hawker. On a clear day, Lundy Island can be seen, and there's also a great deal of interesting local wildlife.

Activity: Walking

Moderate: A well signed and reasonably flat, circular walk. For further details, please see Terrain section.

Dog friendly: Dogs are welcome, but please keep them on short leads near livestock.

Full trail: Miles: 1 (km: 1.6)
Access: Challenging
Duration: 40 mins

## Terrain

A well signed and reasonably flat, circular walk. The ground can get muddy, expecially after rain. Wear some good footwear.

## Total steps: 10

Start point: Rectory Farm tea-room, grid ref: SS205153

- 1. Start in the National Trust car park next to the Rectory Farm tea-room (tenant-run).
- 2. Follow a track at the far end of the car park, past the church to a gate, following signs for the coast path.
- 3. Go through the gate into a field and keep following the path along the top of the field.
- 4. You should pass through two gateways until you reach a third gate at the cliff edge.
- 5. Turn left through the gate and follow the coast path signs to Stanbury.
- 6. Follow the path along the cliff edge; you'll see signs for Hawker's Hut. Go and have a look if you like, it's only a short detour from the route.
- 7. Go through the kissing gate at the end of the field and take a sharp left.
- 8. Follow the path along the hedgerow and through another kissing gate until your reach another gate at the end of the field.
- 9. Go through the gate onto a wide track and follow the track. Before you reach the barn, you'll see a stile on your left signed 'Rectory Farm tea-rooms'.
- 10. Cross the stile and walk across a field until you reach another stile. Cross this and keep going down the track until you reach Rectory Farm tea-room.

End point: Rectory Farm tea-room, grid ref: SS205153
