


CORNWALL

St Agnes Head circular walk

This coastal walk passes the remains of a Second World War training camp, a National Coastwatch Institution (NCI) lookout, and acres of windswept heathland.

Address: St Agnes Head, near St Agnes village,

Moderate: This route features uneven ground, as well as some slopes. For further details, please see Terrain section.

Dog friendly: Dogs are welcome but please keep them on a lead and under close control at all times. Take particular care around cliff edges.

Full trail: Miles: 1 (km: 1.6) Access: Challenging

Duration: 30 mins - 40 mins

Terrain

This route follows a well-maintained but naturally uneven coastal path, which can get muddy after heavy rain. There are slopes to negotiate, as well as cliff edges and mineshafts.

Total steps: 6

Start point: Car park at St Agnes Head. Grid ref: SW702514.

- From the car park, head along the path that leads in a north-easterly direction. Follow it down to the coast path.
- 2. When you reach the coast path, turn left and walk in a westerly direction.
- Continue along the coast path as it passes underneath the National Coastwatch Institution (NCI) lookout.
- 4. After a slight incline, you'll reach a network of paths that lead back around to the car park. Looping back on yourself, take the path to the inland side of the one you've been on
- 5. Head in an easterly direction along the path, through the car park and then past the NCI lookout on the left. This path then joins a tarmac road.
- 6. Continue along the tarmac road to the car park you set out from.

End point: Car park at St Agnes Head. Grid ref: SW702514.
