




DEVON

East Titchberry circular walk

This three-mile circular route incorporates the South West Coast Path and stunning views out to Lundy and returning along the bridleway. Take in views of Shipload Bay and the nature of the Devonshire coastline.



Information

Address: East Titchberry National Trust Car park, grid ref: SS244270

Activity: Walking

Moderate: Varied route with grassy, gravel and concrete paths and bridleway. Part of the route is through farmland. For more information visit the section marked Terrain.

Dog friendly: Dogs are welcome under close control.

Full trail: Miles: 3 (km: 4.8)
Access: Challenging
Duration: 1 hour 10 mins

Terrain

The route is grassy/gravel South West Coast Path and bridleway, with a small section on concrete/tarmac surface through the farmyard. Care should be taken through the farm area. The route incorporates eight field gates, six pedestrian gates and two stiles, along with a number of steps. The route can be slippery when wet. One bench is provided along the route. There maybe grazing cows and sheep on the route.

Total steps: 6

Start point: East Titchberry National Trust car park, grid ref: SS244270

- 1. From the National Trust car park, look towards the farm and head for the stile, at the bottom right-hand corner across the grass.
- 2. Head through the farm entrance gate and across the yard, following the track straight ahead.
- 3. At the end of the yard go through the gate and up the track. At the top of the track turn right and follow the South West Coast Path heading towards Exmansworthy. (For a longer walk turn left here and follow the path to Hartland Point.)
- Continue along the clifftop path and stop to look at a sign commemorating the US Airforce Bomber Crash at Eldern Point in 1943.
- 5. Upon reaching the bridleway/coast path junction, follow the path back through the farm yard to the car park.
- 6. Continue along the farmland path back to the car park where the walk started.

End point: East Titchberry National Trust car park, grid ref: SS244270
