


DEVON

Brownstone to Froward Point circular walk

This route offers spectacular views along the coast, historical features and the chance to spot wildlife. There's also the option to extend your walk to take in a hidden cove and another National Trust place.

Cliff edges

Be aware that parts of the route go close to cliff edges. Keep children and dogs under supervision at all times.

Address: Brownstone car park, Coleton Fishacre, Brownstone Road, Kingswear, TQ6 0EQ, grid ref: SX903510

Activity: Walking

Moderate: The route is mostly on rugged coastal paths. For further details, see Terrain section.

Dog friendly: Dogs should be kept under supervision, especially around cliff edges.

Full trail: Miles: 3 (km: 4.8)

Access: Challenging

Duration: 1 hour

Terrain

The majority of the route is on well-maintained but naturally uneven coastal path, which is steep in places. Be aware of cliff edges and keep children and dogs under supervision at all times. Walking boots are recommended.

Total steps: 4

Start point: Brownstone car park, grid ref SX903510

- 1. From Brownstone car park, follow the path all the way down to Froward Point (clearly signposted). This was a military road built during the Second World War to access a gun emplacement.
- 2. Follow the coastal footpath to the right, towards Outer Froward Point. Along this section of the walk there are spectacular views over the Mewstone.
- 3. Follow the coast path to the edges of Pudcombe Cove. Here, the route heads inland, but a nice detour is to the centre of the coast path at Pudcombe Cove, where there's a viewing point. From there, it's a short walk to the bottom of Coleton Fishacre garden (free entry to National Trust members).
- 4. Follow the footpath inland (this section is steep in places), until you reach Brownstone Road. Head left down this quiet country road to return to Brownstone car park.

End point: Brownstone car park, grid ref: SX903510
