Plains walk at Killerton

This 2-mile dog-friendly walk reveals much of Killerton's wider parkland. The Plains feature veteran trees, open spaces, wildlife and breathtaking views.

Moderate: Route can be muddy in places so it's unsuitable for pushchairs. For further details, please

Dog friendly: Please keep your dog on a lead where sheep and ponies are grazing, and keep an eye on your dog around wildlife and cattle.

Full trail: Miles: 2 (km: 3.2)

Duration: 1 hour 30 mins - 2 hours

Terrain

The terrain is through open parkland, keeping to grassy paths, which can be muddy and slippery when wet, making it unsuitable for pushchairs. There are some steep gradients coming up and down the hill.

Total steps: 12

Start point: Visitor reception, stable block. Grid ref: SS 97622 00091

- 1. Turn right out of visitor reception and take the first right uphill and continue the steep
- 2. At the crossroads continue straight uphill and go through the black metal gate on your right, following the sign to Deer Park and The Plains.
- 3. Go straight, following an old carriageway, before turning left to follow a track up past the quarry. Continue on this path as it swings left above Deer Park with views over the Culm Valley. Go through a gate to reach the open expanse of The Plains.
- 4. At the top of The Plains follow the broad grassy track to the right. It passes through the middle of The Plains. Stick to it, ignoring any paths to the right. Look out for the hawthorn tree overwhelmed by a birch tree. After an enormous crashed sycamore, head towards the back of The Plains to reach a magnificent willow tree that looks split in two.
- 5. Head across the squeeze bridge and into Park Wood. Turn left along the track following sign to Deodar Glen.
- 6. Continue along this path, passing Irishman's Gate.
- 7. Take the left-hand fork marked Deodar Glen Ridge and The Clump. The path offers glimpsed views through the cedars. Follow the path around then turn left uphill to a gate
- 8. Turn left back into The Plains. Continue ahead, turn right through a kissing gate and continue slightly right to an open glade with a log picnic circle. Turn left and climb The Clump over an Iron Age hill fort to the high point among the giant redwoods. Drop down to a track with great views.
- 9. Turn right and follow the track back around The Clump. Follow the path along the edge of the garden, heading downhill.

- 10. Follow the track down and right. Go through a kissing gate, take the next left to go through Bluebell Gate, marked to Front Park. From here you'll get one of Killerton's best views towards Dartmoor.
- 11. Keep left and follow the path downhill.
- 12. You'll reach a kissing gate on the left. Go through the gate and into Front Park Bank, following signs to Stables coffee shop and Shop, continuing straight ahead to reach the house and return to where this walk started.

End point: Visitor reception, stable block. Grid ref: SS 97622 00091
