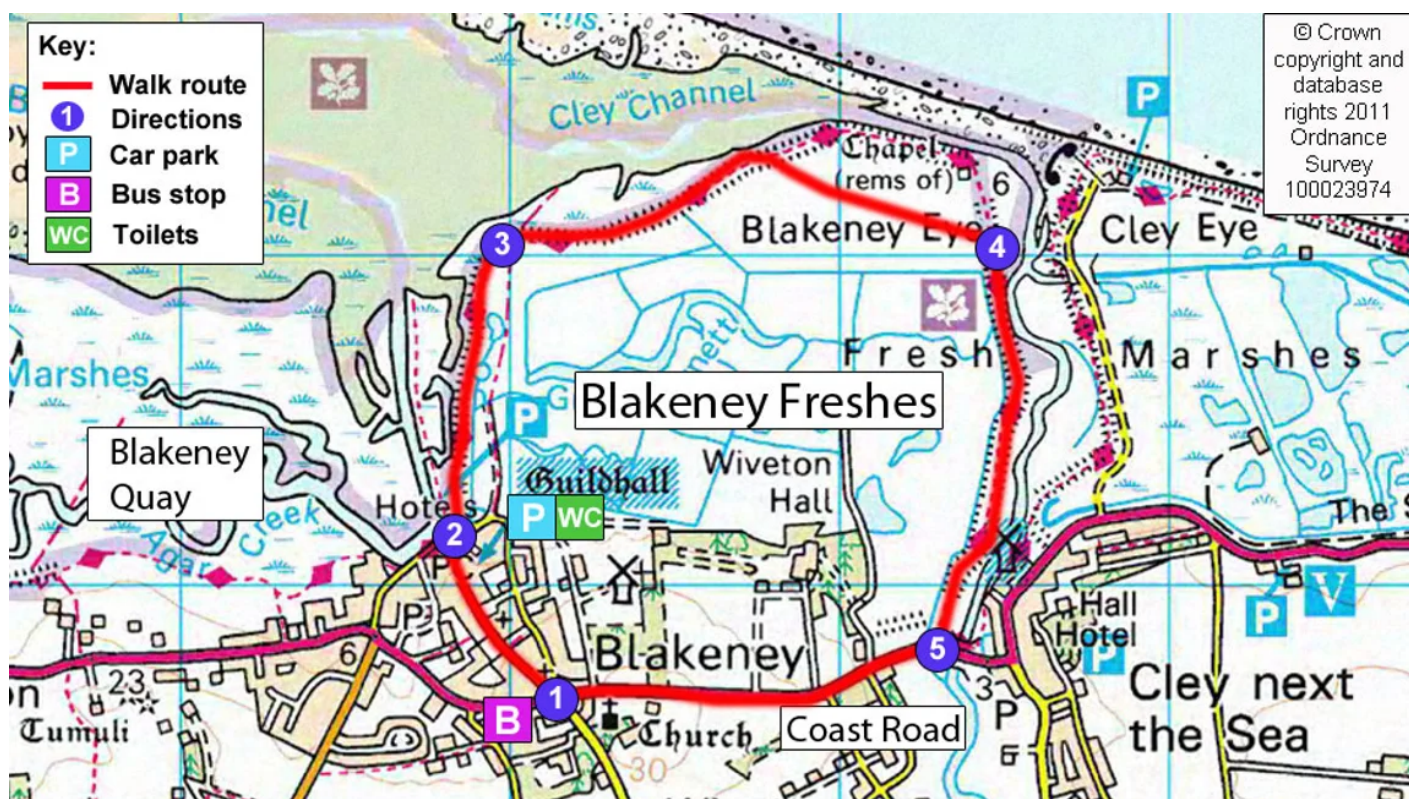

Blakeney Freshes coastal wildlife walk

This stroll through Blakeney village and around Blakeney Freshes is fantastic for spotting wildlife, particularly birds. There are also excellent views to enjoy around Blakeney and Cley harbours. An ideal walk for families.

Address: Bus stop, St Nicolas' Church, Blakeney, grid ref: TG032436

Activity: Walking

Easy: Circular walk along mostly flat ground. For further details, please see Terrain section.

Dog friendly: Dogs welcome under close control along the Norfolk Coast Path on steps 2 to 5 and leads are recommended along roadside sections of the walk.

Full trail: Miles: 3 (km: 4.8)

Access: Easy

Duration: 1 hour 45 mins

Terrain

A circular walk along mostly flat ground. Steps 2 to 5 follow the Norfolk Coast Path along a good surface on top of a grassy bank. Part of the walk is on a pavement alongside the coast road.

Total steps: 5

Start point: Bus stop, St Nicolas' Church, Blakeney, grid ref: TG032436

1. From the bus stop head away from the church into Blakeney village and turn right down the High Street. At the end of the High Street, you will come out onto Blakeney Quay.
2. Cross the main car-parking area of the quay and walk up onto the bank on the right-hand side. From here you can see Blakeney Freshes on your right. Take the footpath on top of the bank out towards the harbour.
3. Follow the same footpath around to the right.
4. Continue along the footpath beside the river, turning right to head back inland.
5. Keep to the footpath on the bank until you reach the A149 between Blakeney and Cley-next-the-Sea. Cross the road and turn right, walk up the hill and cross the road again and stay on the pavement until you are back at the bus stop near St Nicolas' Church.

End point: Bus stop, St Nicolas' Church, Blakeney, grid ref: TG032436
